### Program Level SLO wording

 Needs to be derived from the connected Degree Level/Institutional Level SLO, but seen through the lens of your program/ Service Area



### Hypothetical Example

#### Critical Thinking

Degree Level/Institutional level = analyze
 data/information in addressing and evaluating
 problems and issues in making decisions.

#### Biology Program

• Program Level connection with Critical Thinking = Evaluate biological data, draw reasonable conclusions, recognize the ethical implications of these conclusions, and apply these conclusions to personal, community, and scientific problems.

### Course Mapping

• Is a visual representation regarding courses in a program (services in an area) that connects with the selected outcomes for the program/area.
