

## QUALIFICATIONS

Eligibility for TRiO Student Support Services Programs is determined by federal regulations. To qualify, a student must be a U.S. Citizen or a permanent resident and meet one of the following:

- Meet federal low-income guideline
- Be a first-generation college student
- Have a documented disability

**AND**

- Have academic need
- Plan to graduate with an Associates degree and transfer to a four-year institution.

**\*For SSS-ESL, students must meet the above qualifications and test into ESL English and/or speak, read, write in another language at home.**

## PROGRAM SERVICES

*Services are provided throughout the students' college career as long as they remain a WCC or CCC student*

**Academic Advising** Comprehensive and ongoing assistance with course selection and transfer plans, choosing majors and careers, school planning and test preparation.

**Academic Support** Study skill workshops, one-on-one academic counseling sessions, and study skills inventories to help students develop their skills and improve their academic performance.

**Campus Tours** Get exposed to many of the beautiful four-year campuses that California has to offer. Learn about their resources, transfer requirements, and much more.

**Financial Literacy** We assist students in completing the FAFSA and scholarship applications. We provide workshops focused on increasing financial literacy, covering topics that range from budgeting to credit cards, to help increase their understanding of personal finances and global economic issues.

**Peer Mentoring/Coaching** Students have the opportunity to "learn the ropes" of what it is to be a student at our institution by matching them with successful SSS & SSS-ESL students with whom they may share similar backgrounds.

**S.O.A.R.** Student Orientation & Academic Resources (S.O.A.R), is a one day orientation focused on familiarizing students with our institution, college success and study strategies, transfer information, graduation requirements, and the program expectations.
