- II. Title V Changes and Prerequisites across the District.

Purpose: District senates and curriculum committees must review Title 5 §55003 requirements and decide whether requisites/advisories will be implemented via (a) content review, (b) content review and statistical validation, or (c) content review with statistical validation.

Considerations when making changes to prerequisites:

- 1. The method used to identify courses to which prerequisites might be applied.
- 2. Assurance that prerequisite courses (basic skills) and courses without prerequisites will be reasonably available to students.
- 3. The research to be used to determine impact of new prerequisites (especially disproportionate impact).
- 4. Provisions for training the curriculum committee on content review.

Questions for consideration:

- 1. What assurances do students have that the courses they need will be reasonably available?
- 2. What evidence or data will be useful to determine the impact of new prerequisites?
- 3. What timeline will be used (if other than the 2 year review for CTE or 6 year review for all others)?
- 4. How will the college monitor for disproportionate impact?
- 5. What methods can be used to identify courses to which prerequisites might be applied?

It was determined that the curriculum committee would further investigate the issue and make a recommendation to the Academic Senate.
