- V. UPDATE: Diversity Survey
  - Committee developed a survey last spring to send out to students and employees to access the climate of the college.
  - Gen took the survey to college council in which it was decided that the survey be taken to PIE committee.
  - Gen took the survey to PIE and discussed extensively giving feedback
    - Current iteration there is not general support, but they do have support in developing a survey. The intent of the survey is not clear.
      - Look at our intent and work through committee processes to have the survey developed collectively. (Institutional charge).
      - Committee members who serve on other committees should help move

the conversation along about creating an institutional survey developed around diversity.

- PIE is not sure what the process is for a committee to move forward a survey. Gen did push for consistency in feedback. Diversity is the first committee to submit a survey like this (climate and committee based).

- VI. DISCUSSION: Spring 2019 Events & Funding
  - LCC does Black History Month and Women's History Month 1 hr. event during college hour as well as a daylong Native American Empowerment Day (March 15 or 29), Si Se Puede daylong event (March 2 or 9).
    - Will have to speak with Dean Wylie regarding the budget for these events.
    - Migrant ED has traditionally paid for Keynote Speaker for Si Se Puede.
  - Mary is planning with community members Cultural Competency in Native American Communities FLEX presentation.
  - Local Museum (Middletown) hosting an Asian Exhibit History of Race -
  - Will send out an edited list to include Lake in spreadsheet to add to funding request.
  - Mary will send the information and details as well as talk to Dean Wylie about budget.
  - Do the committee members have a role in the planning of these events?
    - Support (as needed) and Attend
  - Someone has to have a relationship with the (community) in which we are celebrating.
  - Partnerships with other community organizations.
  - Think about how we are connected back out in our communities and how can we bring that to the college. Have community members involved in the event planning.

- LCC had Native American Day on 9/27 hour long event. Members from the community on the board of supervisors came and spoke and Mary spoke regarding the Native American Studies class.

- LCC has a Luau scheduled at the end of the month as a fundraiser for student scholarships. Hosted by the Culinary Department.
- Neli attended the second half of Dia de los Muertos, well attended, however we need to do a better job at advertising. Since it was held in the lobby of the library which led them into the library to see the alters that were created.
- Gen attended the first half of the Dia de los Muertos event held in the ME center. Talked about who they wanted to remember and what their knowledge was of Dia de los Muertos. More of an intimate event. Cross section of people (administrators, faculty, staff, students).
