Yuba Community College District, Yuba College, and Woodland Community College are recognized by ACCJC and authorized by the California Community College Chancellor's Office to grant the degrees of Associate in Arts and Associate in Science. Eligible students include those who have completed the subject requirements for graduation and who have maintained a 2.0 average in subjects attempted. Students must also complete the general education residency and competency requirements set forth in Title 5 regulations.

Students may be awarded a Certificate of Achievement upon successful completion of a minimum of 16 or more semester units of degree-applicable coursework designed as a pattern of learning experiences designed to develop certain capabilities that may be oriented to career or general education.

The Chancellor shall establish procedures to determine degree and certificate requirements that include appropriate involvement of the local curriculum committee. The procedures shall assure that graduation requirements are published in the District's colleges' catalogs and included in other resources that are convenient for students.
