This evening I am sharing with you the results from last week's ASCCC Fall Plenary. Our senate VP Deanna Pierro, Senator Jose Vallejo, and I enjoyed ASCCC very thoughtful program of general and break-out sessions. Some highlights of the event include:

- A general session and break-out sessions on how we can reimagine our program review process to be more student-centered and framed in this era of Guided Pathways and AB705.
- A passionate Keynote presentation by Dr. Daniel Walker titled "We are the key, not the lock".
- A focused conversation on our hiring and thinking of equity by considering how individual
 colleges consider their hiring practices with screening processes to fully consider the
 Second Minimum Qualification that include "criteria that include a sensitivity to and
 understanding of the diverse academic, socioeconomic, cultural, disability, and ethnic
 backgrounds of community college students." California Ed Code §87360
- Advocacy for faculty diversification and the impact on our student success.
