5.	Colleague Self-Service Presentation Information/Discussion	Howerton Dr. Lolland/ CTO Crosby	Background: YCCD is implementing Colleague Self-Service. Phase I went live on Labor Day. Phase II will include additional elements such as student planning, degree audit, student Ed Plans, and new Registration functionality. Reference/Background Information: Colleague Self-Service Presentation to the YCCD BOT Objective: To update the Senate on the implementation timeline, and steps taken to ensure that both colleges are involved with the development.
	<i>Discussion/Decision:</i> CTO Crosby shared with the senate an update on the timeline for implementation for Colleague Self-Service and reviewed the attached presentation. Phase 1 went live on Labor Day, so most faculty have now seen it. The pilot program is in process for Sociology and ECE, and the guided pathways element will be added once the paths/sequences are developed. Lanier asked how it will be rolled out to students and whether there will be training. Crosby replied that videos will be created for students once feedback has been solicited on the pilot programs. Phase 2 will go live in April in time for summer/fall 2020 registration. Phase 3 goes live in November 2020 for all disciplines provided faculty feedback has taken place to develop those course maps/sequences for the metamajors. Vallejo expressed some skepticism regarding the timelines. Crosby replied that WebAdvisor will lose support in 2021, so this transition is necessary. Howerton added that we will need strong faculty involvement to ensure that all the programs will be completed by the deadlines. VC Lolland noted that this is a powerful tool that will ultimately benefit students. Crosby added that the financial aid component of the program would be developed after the other areas of the program have been completed.
