Current results for the 2020-2021 ASCCC Executive Committee: President- Dolores Davison; Vice-President Virginia "Ginni" May; Secretary – Cheryl Aschenback; Treasurer Mayra Cruz; At-Large – Michelle Bean. Current round of voting for North & South Representatives, then the area elections will follow.

- 4/29 Follow-up Meeting on DE Addendums We discussed the timeline and the mechanisms for which we will employ to meet the required deadlines to submit our Emergency Temporary DE addendums to the state. May 20 deadline for Summer, and July 1 for our Fall. We also discussed the professional development and trainings that are going on, as well as accreditation reporting that might be necessary.

- 4. 5/1 PIE We discussed the CARES act allocation, strong workforce and local process of aligning projects to the guidelines of this allocation, we started to discuss the needed process of new program validation prior to curriculum development, update on the timeline for our Land Based Learning grant, and an update on the new VC with our district budget process. We agreed to stick to a once-a-month meeting schedule for 20-21. We will meet first Fridays from 10-11:45, and 3rd Fridays maybe used for taskforce/workgroups as needed. We have prioritized catalog, PR with staffing integration, scheduling/SEM, and new program vetting process.
- 5. 5/1 College Council We discussed the benefit of joint meetings with academic senate. We have tentatively scheduled our first full senate meeting (8/28) as a joint meeting during our first

hour of senate, and the 5th Friday in January as a joint session. I will work with Dr. Pimentel and College Council co-chair to draft the agendas for these joint planning sessions. There was an update provided about the management team structure. The new dean of arts and sciences will start in June. The name of the successful candidate is in the YCCD Board Packet for May. The WCC VPSS selection is still in progress. Hopefully, there will be a successful candidate that will go to the board in June with a July 1st start date. The LCC dean is on the same timeline as the VPSS. The WCC fiscal analyst position closes soon. Faculty search committees are completing their work and selecting final candidates for second round interviews. We also had an update about: the new building and other construction projects on the campus; commencement; the CARES Act; possible student forum for feedback and answers to concerns with our transition to remote instruction. There is also some early discussion about our process of "opening" back up the campus and the necessary steps and precautions.
