## **About the Symposium**

**Woodland Community College's Student Research Symposium** is hosted every spring to highlight the diverse research interests of our students. For over a decade, students from different academic disciplines have come together to share research from their classes, both completed projects and works in progress.

The 11th year marks both a shift to a virtual format, and an exclusive focus on primary research. The projects featured this year are original, empirical pilot studies designed and conducted by students in psychology and sociology research methods courses:

### **PSYCH 7 – Research Methods in Psychology, Professor Alison Buckley**

This course covers the many research designs and methods in psychology, including descriptive, associative, and causal claims. The various instrumentation, collection procedures, data collection and analysis, and reporting procedures are also examined. Research methods and design will be surveyed from a wide section of psychological fields.

### **SOCIL 8— Social Science Research Methods, Professor Nili Kirschner**

Covers basic issues in the design and implementation of social science research. Topics covered include the scientific method, ethics, research design, basic descriptive and inferential statistics, and qualitative and quantitative methodologies. Student will conduct original research projects.

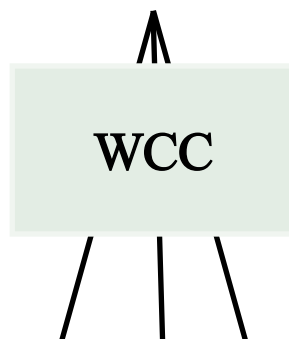
