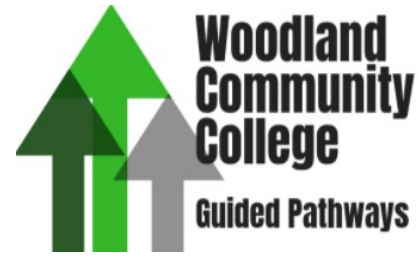

Associate of Arts Degree for Transfer in Sociology

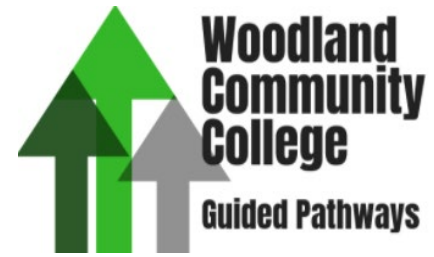
