The availability of that data by program has been changed and we are now using Perkins IV Core 4 employment reports. For consistency, we used Perkins IV Core 4 data to previously reported periods that span this report to show the trend so if you were to compare this report to 2021 and 2022 annual submissions the numbers were differ due to the source change.

Only programs that had 10 or more total students for employment rates were included in the report to mask for privacy and compute a meaningful average to compare historically.
