THE FUTURE WAS YESTERDAY: HIGHER EDUCATION'S GREAT UPHEAVAL & THE NEEDS OF THE NEW LEARNER

Scott Van Pelt, Co-author of The Great Upheaval, and Director of Research and Faculty Affairs at the University of Pennsylvania

The United States is undergoing a profound transformation. As the world evolves into a highly interconnected knowledge economy, the forces of technological innovation, globalization, and shifting demographics present both unprecedented challenges and boundless opportunities. But these macro trends tell only part of the story. Even before the pandemic, institutions stood at a crossroads; today, student needs and challenges have shifted rapidly and dramatically, even as online education and the growing integration of AI tools in classrooms and workplaces have introduced new complexities, new risks, and new possibilities. In this session, Scott Van Pelt, co-author of The Great Upheaval: Higher Education's Past, Present, and Uncertain Future and its forthcoming sequel, will explore how institutions—particularly two-year colleges—can adapt to meet the evolving needs of learners in a time of sweeping change.
